The following points should be borne in mind when buying a calculator. Firstly, there is the number of things the calculator can do. The most basic type of calculators have simply the four arithmetical functions (additions, subtraction, multiplication and division), with perhaps a few other functions like percentage and square root. Next, there are calculators with a 'memory' which allows you to store information, do more calculations and recall the information when you need it. Some more expensive calculators are programmable *ie.*, there is a choice of complex calculating routines which will be done automatically. In some calculators it is not very easy to see. The display should also be bright, so that it can be read in any light.

The third important point is the power units. Calculators may be mains-operated or battery operated. Mains operated ones are cheaper to run if you use them a lot. Battery operated ones may be run on ordinary batteries, or by special 'long life' batteries or by rechargeable batteries.
