- The term **modernism** is widely used to identify new and <u>distinctive</u> features in the **subjects**, **forms**, **concepts**, and **styles** of literature and the other arts in the early decades of the twentieth century
- especially after World War I (1914–18).
- break with some of the traditional bases not only of Western art, but of Western culture in general

- The catastrophe of the war
- o faith was shaken
- Coherence lost
- durability of Western civilization raised doubts
- Suspicion about the adequacy of traditional literary modes to represent the harsh and dissonant realities of the postwar world.

- introduced hitherto neglected and sometimes forbidden subject matter.

- Harold Pinter (1930-2008)





- Collected poems (1936)
- Four Quartets (1943)
