ADD TRANSITIONS & INTERNAL SUMMARIES

INTERNAL SUMMARIES REVIEW CONTENT

Review: So, our jails are full, and our law enforcement budgets are meager. A third problem facing crime prevention is political infighting.

Preview: Political infighting takes the forms of what we call railroading and road blocking.

- 1. RESTATE THE THESIS**
- 2. REVIEW MAIN IDEAS**
- 3. REINFORCE RELEVANCE OF IDEAS**
- 4. BRING A SENSE OF CLOSURE**
