



The Club members of PG classes attended a two- day nature camp at Parambikulam Tiger Reserve on 20^{th} and 21^{st} of June 2022.





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
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3.WORKSHOP ON PREPARARTION AND DIGITALISATION OF BIODIVERSITY PARK

A Workshop on "Preparation & Digitalisation of Biodiversity Park" was conducted on 23-06-2022 by Mr Dinesh Souparnika, a member of Open agricultural Team. The club members from Dept of Zoology as well as Botany participated in the training on how to prepare QR coding and how to record details of biodiversity. After a Session in AV hall, the students were given classes at herbal garden on how to set a biodiversity park. Sir distributed a handbook on different components to be present in a biodiversity park. Volunteers were selected to work on collecting data for digitalization activities.





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4. DAY NATURE CAMP AT SHENDURUNY WILD LIFE SANCTUARY

A nature camp was conducted by Bhoomithrasena and Zoology Department in association with the Kerala Forest Department from 1st August 2022 to 3rd August 2022 at Shendurney Wildlife Sanctuary, Kollam for 3rd B.Sc. Zoology students. The camp was guided by Assistant Wildlife Warden Mr. Shijin. The students reached the wildlife sanctuary by 5:00 p.m. of the first day. An introductory class was conducted by the guide introducing the basics of camp and the animals and birds that students can see on the forest. They also shared their earlier experiences during the camps and listed the rules and regulations that should be followed during the camp. In the second day, trekking was conducted in Kalamkunnu forest and showed the traces of animals, different kinds of insects, types of trees, peculiarities of each types, dam and lakes. The day ended with the cultural programs organised by the students. The forest range officer V P Jayan was the guest for the cultural programs. He shared about his experiences and interacted with the students. In the third day, the students were taken for bird watching. The students were made aware of the different ways of observing birds, difference in sounds and the physical appearance of birds and how such features can be used for identifying birds. The students were taken to a deer park. A quiz was conducted for the students at the end of the session. Closing ceremony was held where students shared their experiences of the camp and certificate were distributed to the students. The camp concluded by 5:00 p.m. of 3rd August 2023.



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
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5. WORLD ELEPHANT DAY OBSERVATION (12/08/2022)

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
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WEBINAR ON PLASTIC FROM STARCH- A NOVEL APPROACH in connection with Swachahata Pakwada September 1-15


No. of participants: 60 Date: 14/09/2022
