Cleaning -Primary Health Centre, Kottaram

Location: Primary Health Center (PHC), Kottaram

World Cycle Day Observation


Date: 5/6/2023

Awareness programme- Blood Donation


Date: 16/6/2023

One day Workshop on Wellness through Yogic Practice






Description of the Programme:


Description of the Programme:

In his inaugural address, Dr. SHIHAB emphasized the pivotal role of NSS in fostering social responsibility and community engagement among students. He highlighted the significance


of NSS Day as an occasion to reflect on the achievements and contributions of NSS towards nation-building and social upliftment.




Description of the Programme:




World Mental Health Day Observation





Sneharamam

Location: Pazhaya Palam, Opposite MES Keveeyam College

Objective of the Program:

Under the "Malinya Muktha Navakeralam" (Waste-Free New Kerala) campaign, the Government of Kerala conceived 'Sneharamam', an initiative aimed at converting around 3,000 garbage dumpsites across the state into clean and green Sneharamam parks. NSS Units 91 and 105 of MES Keveeyam College Valanchery had the opportunity to participate in this initiative, collaborating with Valanchery Municipality and Suchitwa Mission, Malappuram. Valanchery Municipality and Suchitwa Mission, Malappuram identified and allocated three garbage dumpsites to the college, including sites in (1) Kottaram-Pazhayapalam, opposite MES Keveeyam College, (2) Alinchode, and (3) Oniyil Palam.

Description of the Programme:

After conducting several meetings attended by Ashraf Ambalathingal, the Municipal Chairman of Valanchery, Aiswarya, an official from Suchitwa Mission Malappuram, Dr. K.P Vinod Kumar, the Principal of MES Keveeyam College Valanchery, Swapna N R and Ledid Bin Abdul Khader, the NSS Programme Officers, Dr Midhunraj K K, and NSS secretaries Meerakrishna C M, Arshad, and NSS volunteers, a decision was made to clean these three sites and establish gardens there.

(1) Kottaram-Pazhayapalam, opposite MES Keveeyam College:

This location had become a dumping ground for garbage, which was being thrown into the stream flowing under the bridge. To protect the area, the volunteers initiated the construction of a protection wall along the bridge to prevent garbage from entering the stream. To enhance the wall's attractiveness, the volunteers decorated it with painted waste glasses, transforming it into a selfie spot. The wall was further adorned with threads. To convert the space into a garden, volunteers planted bamboos and mango saplings. Two chairs were also placed to make the area more inviting for visitors. The bamboo walls and glass paintings added to the beauty of the spot. In this initiative, the NSS of the college received support and sponsorship from the college alumni association, students, and various external agencies such as Leadex, as well as from local residents. Currently, many people visit this location and spend their evenings there.

Protective Measures: Volunteers commenced the project by constructing a protective wall along the bridge to prevent garbage from entering the stream. This proactive step not only mitigated the immediate environmental hazard but also laid the foundation for further beautification efforts.

Aesthetic Enchantments: To enhance the visual appeal of the protective wall, volunteers creatively adorned it with painted waste glasses and threads, effectively transforming it into a captivating selfie spot. This innovative approach not only repurposed waste materials but also encouraged environmental consciousness among visitors.

Greenery and Green Space: In addition to the aesthetic enhancements, volunteers undertook the task of converting the area into a green space. Bamboo and mango saplings were planted, breathing new life into the surroundings and promoting biodiversity. Two chairs were strategically placed to make the area more welcoming and conducive to relaxation and social interaction.

Outcome and Impact: As a result of these concerted efforts, the once neglected location has been transformed into a popular destination for visitors. The bamboo walls, glass paintings, and lush greenery have significantly enhanced the beauty of the spot, attracting numerous people who now choose to spend their evenings enjoying the serene surroundings.

The initiative spearheaded by the NSS volunteers serves as a shining example of grassroots efforts to address environmental challenges and foster community engagement. By combining protective measures with aesthetic enhancements and community involvement, the project has not only revitalized the area but also instilled a sense of pride and ownership among residents. SNEHARAMAM

Under the "Malinya Muktha Navakeralam" (Waste-Free New Kerala) campaign, the Government of Kerala conceived 'Sneharamam', an initiative aimed at converting around 3,000 garbage dumpsites across the state into clean and green Sneharamam parks. NSS Units 91 and 105 of MES Keveeyam College Valanchery had the opportunity to participate in this initiative, collaborating with Valanchery Municipality and Suchitwa Mission, Malappuram. Valanchery Municipality and Suchitwa Mission, Malappuram identified and allocated three garbage dumpsites to the college, including sites in (1) Kottaram-Pazhayapalam, opposite MES

Keveeyam College, (2) Alinchode, and (3) Oniyil Palam. Out of these three, two sites were beautified during the seven day residential camp by the volunteers (Alinchode and Oniyil Palam.

After conducting several meetings attended by Ashraf Ambalathingal, the Municipal Chairman of Valanchery, Aiswarya, an official from Suchitwa Mission Malappuram, Dr. K.P Vinod Kumar, the Principal of MES Keveeyam College Valanchery, Swapna N R and Ledid Bin Abdul Khader, the NSS Programme Officers, Dr Midhunraj K K, and NSS secretaries Meerakrishna C M, Arshad, and NSS volunteers, a decision was made to clean these three sites and establish gardens there.

(1) Alinchode:

NSS volunteers painted a banyan tree in Alinchode, making it more attractive. The walls in the area were also beautified with paintings.



(2) Oniyil Palam:

This site was located along the Valanchery-Ponnani highway and had been used as a garbage dumping spot. The NSS units first cleaned the area and transformed it into a garden by planting mango and sappotta saplings. A wall was also constructed using bamboos. The bamboo wall was decorated with bottles that were painted by the volunteers, using bottles provided by one of the villagers as a refreshing drink. This act showcased how plastic bottles could be repurposed as decorative pieces. With the support of IMA Valanchery, the NSS units were able to place two chairs, making the area more inviting for people to visit.
