



# Free Eye Check-Up Camp

On 23rd December 2024, a Free Eye Check-Up Camp was organized at Govt, HSS Perashannoor, as part of the NSS Residential Camp, in collaboration with Ahalya Eye Hospital, Kottakkal. The camp was held from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM, with over 120 people from the Perashannoor area participating. A team of 3 experienced ophthalmologists, along with 15 supporting staff from the hospital, conducted detailed eye







examinations, which included tests for vision acuity, cataracts, and general eye health. Based on the assessments, patients were provided with recommendations for further treatment. Moreover, the hospital supplied free medicines for those diagnosed with eye-related issues. The camp successfully provided much-needed healthcare to the local community and raised awareness about the importance of eye health.

# **Detailed Camp Activities Overview:**

#### 1. Morning Warm-Up Sessions:

The morning sessions were structured to energize the participants and promote physical and mental wellbeing. Each day began with one of the following:

- Zumba Sessions: A high-energy workout routine designed to kick-start the day. The participants
  engaged in rhythmic movements to music, which not only helped in boosting their fitness but also
  increased enthusiasm among the volunteers. Zumba helped foster an environment of fun while
  promoting coordination and cardiovascular fitness.
- Yoga Sessions: In these sessions, volunteers practiced traditional yoga techniques, which focused on
  improving flexibility, mental clarity, and stress relief. The sessions helped promote mindfulness,
  deep breathing, and self-reflection, preparing the participants for the day ahead with a calm and clear
  mind.
- Warm-Up Games: The warm-up games were designed to promote teamwork and physical
  coordination. Activities like relay races, tug-of-war, and obstacle courses were organized to build

#### 2. Renovation of the Old Auditorium:


The renovation of the old, unused auditorium at Govt. HSS Perashannoor stands as one of the major achievements of the camp. The school did not have a functional auditorium, and this space had been left neglected for many years. During the camp, the NSS volunteers took it upon themselves to breathe new life into the auditorium.

 Initial Condition (Before): The auditorium was dirty, filled with broken furniture, and had a faded, worn-out appearance. It was not usable for any school or public events.





Transformation (After): The participants cleaned the auditorium thoroughly, removed broken
furniture, fixed the electrical wiring, and gave the entire space a fresh coat of paint. New seating
arrangements and proper lighting systems were installed to create an appropriate environment for
hosting events. The revamped auditorium now stands as a vital resource for hosting school functions,
activities, and community gatherings, adding immense value to the school infrastructure.










#### 3. Painting of the School Building:

The school building, consisting of three LP classrooms, had a significant impact on the learning environment. The building had accumulated dust and grime over time, affecting the aesthetic appearance of the space.

Initial Condition (Before): The classrooms were dusty, old, and appeared dark and uninviting. The
building had not been maintained for a long period, and its dilapidated look reflected poorly on the
learning environment.




Result (After): The NSS volunteers undertook the task of thoroughly cleaning the classrooms. They
removed dust, cobwebs, and trash that had accumulated over the years. The volunteers then painted
the classrooms, transforming them into bright and welcoming spaces for students. The newly painted







classrooms not only look refreshed but have given the students and teachers an enhanced space for studying, teaching, and learning. The bright, clean classrooms motivate students to come to school each day with renewed energy.



#### 4. Renovation of the Children's Play Park:

The Children's Play Park was a space that held significant potential but had become dull and unattractive. It was a key area in need of improvement for the school and local community.

- Initial Condition (Before): The park, although used by children, had faded, peeling paint and an
  uninspiring color scheme. The equipment was still functional, but it did not provide an appealing or
  stimulating environment.
- Revamping the Park (During Camp): The NSS volunteers took it upon themselves to transform
  the entire park. They repainted the existing playground equipment with vibrant colors that appealed
  to young children. The park was spruced up by adding new decorative elements, including colorful
  patterns and positive messages, giving it a more cheerful and fun atmosphere.

Outcome (After): The children's play park now serves as an energizing space for recreation. The
bright new colors and revitalized atmosphere contribute to a playful, happy environment where
children can enjoy their free time in a positive setting.



#### 5. Renovation of the Smrithi Vanam (Garden):

The Smrithi Vanam, a commemorative garden within the school grounds, had become overgrown and needed thorough renovation. It was intended to be a peaceful place for reflection, but it had been left untended for a long time.

Initial Condition (Before): The garden was overgrown with weeds, and many of the plants were no
longer thriving. It had a neglected appearance, and some areas were filled with debris. It was not
being used for reflection or leisure, as it had lost its intended purpose.







- Work Done (During Camp): The NSS volunteers cleared the area, pulled out weeds, and gathered
  the trash and old materials cluttering the space. They replanted new fruit trees such as mango, guava,
  and banana, focusing on sustainability and the benefit it would provide to future generations.
- Outcome (After): The Smrithi Vanam is now an aesthetically pleasing and sustainable space. The
  garden will now thrive with the new trees and provide a beautiful, tranquil place for reflection, with
  future generations benefiting from the natural products of the garden.



## 6. Digital Literacy Survey and Mobile Phone Usage Class:

In addition to the physical improvements, the NSS volunteers conducted a **Digital Literacy Survey** in the village of Perashannoor. The survey was aimed at assessing the level of digital awareness and mobile phone usage among the local community.

- Survey Findings: Through the survey, NSS volunteers gathered valuable data on the challenges
  faced by residents in using mobile phones, including difficulties with navigation, lack of knowledge
  about digital tools, and security concerns.
- Training Program: Using the data collected, the volunteers organized a Mobile Phone Usage Class
  for the villagers. This training session provided hands-on guidance on basic mobile phone
  operations, as well as information on using phones for essential tasks such as banking, government
  services, and staying connected with family and friends.
- Impact: The class significantly improved the digital literacy of the local population, helping them
  unlock the potential of their mobile devices. It bridged the digital divide and ensured that people are
  now more equipped to use technology for personal, professional, and social growth.




# Interaction with NSS Volunteers







# Report on Relief Activities by NSS Units of MES Keveeyam College in Response to Wayanad Landslide and Valanchery Floods

On July 30, 2024, Wayanad, Kerala, witnessed one of the worst landslides in India's history, devastating several villages, including Punchirimattam, Chooralmala, and Mundakkai. The scale of the destruction was unfathomable, with over 231 confirmed deaths and hundreds of others still missing. As a result, several families were displaced, and the region was left in ruins. In the aftermath of this tragedy, many parts of Wayanad remain abandoned, with debris scattered across what was once a thriving landscape.

Alongside the Wayanad tragedy, the monsoon also affected nearby areas in Valanchery, including Kodumudi, Deep, and other parts, causing widespread flooding. As part of their ongoing commitment to social responsibility, the NSS (National Service Scheme) Units of MES Keveeyam College initiated a series of relief activities aimed at assisting the victims of the Wayanad landslide as well as providing immediate relief to the flood-affected areas of Valanchery.

NSS Relief Activities for Wayanad Landslide and Valanchery Floods

1. Initial Response to the Wayanad Landslide and Valanchery Floods

Date: July 31, 2024

Activity: Help Desk and Fund Collection Drive

In the immediate aftermath of the Wayanad landslide and the flooding in Valanchery, the NSS Units of MES Keveeyam College took swift action to assist the affected communities. On July 31, 2024, a **Help Desk** was set up within the college to provide support to people from the Valanchery area, particularly those in areas like Kodumudi and Deep, which had been severely impacted by floods.

## 2. Cleaning Drives in Valanchery (Kodumudi and Deep Areas)

Date: July 31, 2024 & August 1, 2024

Activity: House Cleaning and Relief Support in Flood-Affected Areas

Under the guidance of Programme Officers Swapna N R and Ledid Bin Abdul Khader, the NSS volunteers visited Kodumudi (on July 31) and Deep (on August 1) areas in Valanchery to conduct cleaning drives and assist residents in flood-hit regions. The cleaning teams focused on clearing debris, mud, and water-logged materials from houses, which had been inundated by the heavy rains. The team was involved in cleaning five flood-affected houses in Kodumudi on July 31 and continued the cleaning efforts in Deep area on August 1. These activities provided immediate relief to the affected families and helped restore a sense of normalcy in these communities.











## 3. Procurement and Distribution of Relief Materials

Date: August 2, 2024

Activity: Purchase and Distribution of Goods for Wayanad Landslide Victims

On August 2, 2024, the NSS volunteers, with the funds raised through the campaign, purchased essential goods worth ₹20,000 for the victims of the Wayanad landslide. These items included stationery, cleaning materials, and other relief essentials. The collected goods were then transported to the NSS Malappuram District Collection Centre at Govt. College, Malappuram, where they were distributed to those affected by the disaster in Wayanad.









## 4. Additional Relief Collection and Support

Dates: August 6-7, 2024

Activity: Collection of Toys, Stationery, and Other Relief Materials

Between August 6 and August 7, 2024, the NSS Units continued their relief efforts by collecting additional materials, particularly toys, notebooks, and pens, from the students and faculty of MES Keveeyam College. The collected items, along with other essential supplies, were purchased and taken to the District Collection Centre in Malappuram. The total value of the materials collected during this drive was approximately ₹30,000. This contributed further to the relief work for the Wayanad landslide victims.






### Active Participation in Anti-Drug Campaign Rally




### NSS Seven-Day Residential Camp Report








#### NATIONAL LIFE SAVIOUR FORCE TRAINING PROGRAMME
